

Butterfly Feeder

Materials:

Pie Tin

Twine


Hole Punch

Scissors

Citrus Fruit

Beads (optional)

1. Punch four holes in the pie tin lip. In the pattern of North, South, East and West.
2. Measure and cut four pieces of twine (about 18 or more inches).
3. Insert a string through each hole in pie tin, then tie a knot to secure them to the tin.
4. Create a pattern with the beads to a desired length on each string. Keep in mind that butterflies love bright colors.
5. When finished, bring ends of the strings together and tie at the top.
6. Cut up fresh “butterfly fruit” and hang in a desired location. Try oranges, soft bananas, berries, pineapples, melons, papayas, pears and plums cut into chunks or slices.
7. Hang it up outside and watch for butterflies!
